School of Dentistry – Variation to admissions policy for 2025 entry

This policy provides detail on the additional requirements of the following programmes offered by the School of Dentistry:

- BDS Bachelor of Dental Surgery (A200)
- BSc Dental Therapy and Dental Hygiene (B752)
- DipHE Diploma in Dental Hygiene (B750)

Note: this policy should be read in conjunction with the <u>Cardiff University Admissions Policies</u> and published entry requirements.

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1. Pre-application eligibility checks

- 1.1 To be eligible to apply for these programmes you must:
 - a) be 18 years of age by 31 December of year 1 (please see the <u>age on entry policy</u> for more information).
 - b) and fulfil the Fitness to Practice regulations and eligibility to pursue regulated programmes requirements (please see the <u>Fitness to Practise and eligibility to pursue</u> regulated programmes policy for more information).
 - c) and meet the minimum entry requirements at Level 2 (typically GCSE) and Level 3 (typically A level), including grade and subject requirements.

2. Entry requirements

- 2.1 The typical entry requirements for GCSEs, A level, BTEC, International Baccalaureate (IB), and T Level applicants are published on <u>Coursefinder</u> and <u>UCAS</u> (including grade and subject requirements, and whether or not these qualifications are accepted).
- 2.2 All applicants must provide evidence of prior academic capability in externally moderated, publicly validated examinations, e.g., GCSE, IGCSE, or equivalent qualifications. For applicants with UK qualifications, only those that are defined in the <u>National Database of Accredited Qualifications</u> are acceptable.
- **2.3 Non-standard entry requirements:** Applicants who do not meet the standard entry requirements should refer to the appendices for further guidance.

2.3 Resits:

- For the BDS programme (A200), A Level resit applicants are not considered. Resits will be considered for those applying with predicted grades who are given a Conditional Offer after interview and accept the offer as their Firm choice. Applicants will have their offer honoured for one year only, based on the minimum entry requirements being achieved at resit.
- Resits are considered acceptable for entry for B750 and B752 in line with the University's resit policy.
- GCSE resits are considered entry for A200, B750, and B752 but the resit grade must be achieved by the relevant application deadline.
- **2.4 UCAT (A200 only):** Applicants to A200 are required to take the University Clinical Aptitude Test (UCAT) during July to October of the year of application. Test results obtained in previous years are not accepted. The UCAT score may be used as part of the interview shortlisting or offer selection process. There is no minimum score and the cut-off (if the UCAT is used) varies each cycle.
 - 2.4.1 Any extenuating circumstances relating to the UCAT must be submitted to UCAT and follow their policy and procedures
- **2.5 Transfers:** Transfers (also known as RPL) onto A200, B750, and B752 are not accepted.
- **2.6 Current undergraduate students:** Applicants applying before final completion of an honours degree should be in their final year. Any offer will be based on achieving a 2:1 or higher (A200) or 2:2 (B750 and B752) as well as having achieved the minimum entry requirements for

graduatesApplicants who have started a degree, but have chosen not to complete it, may apply but must have:

- withdrawn from their course and
- have provided the Dental Admissions Team (dentalcentralenquiries@cardiff.ac.uk) with a letter from their university confirming the withdrawal was voluntary and not as the result of failure to progress due to poor academic performance or probity concerns.
- As long as both these conditions are met, the application will be considered within the
 applicant cohort for the year of application and will be subject to the full selection
 process in line with those applying with achieved A levels.

3. UCAS application deadlines

- 3.1 For the BDS programme (A200), you must submit a fully completed application (including all achieved and pending academic and English language qualifications, reference, and personal statement) via UCAS by 15 October 2024 at 18:00hrs (UK time).
 - 3.1.1 Applications submitted after the stipulated UCAS deadline will not be considered and will be rejected as late.
 - 3.1.2 Where we are unable to give an academic score to your application due to missing information, including where a personal statement or reference has not been supplied, your application will be rejected as incomplete.
- 3.2 For the BSc Dental Therapy and Dental Hygiene (B752) and DipHE Dental Hygiene (B750) programmes, you must submit a fully completed application (including achieved and pending academic and English language qualifications, references, and personal statement) via UCAS by the equal consideration deadline (29 January 2025 at 18:00 (UK time)) to be guaranteed consideration.
 - 3.2.1 Applications received after the Equal Consideration Deadline (ECD) will be considered subject to interview places being available. If no places are available, applications submitted after the ECD will not be considered and will be rejected as late.
 - 3.2.2 Where time permits, we will contact applicants to request additional relevant information to allow us to make a decision. As this is time-sensitive due to the highly competitive nature of the programmes, applicants will be given a strict deadline to respond. If you are asked for more information and do not supply this by the stipulated deadline your application will be rejected as incomplete. However, in this circumstance you may reapply for the programme through the UCAS Extra or Clearing process if applications remain open.
- 3.3 If you have non-standard qualifications or Level 3+ qualifications that have already been achieved, we recommend you email certificates and transcripts to us at the same time as submitting your UCAS application. You can upload copies of your qualifications to our application portal (sims.cf.ac.uk) upon receipt of your Cardiff University username and password, or PDF/JPEG copies can be sent directly to admissions@cardiff.ac.uk from the email address you have given on your UCAS application with 'Dentistry application supporting documents' in the subject line and your full name, programme you have applied to, and UCAS ID in the body of the email.

4. Selection process

- 4.1 If you meet the minimum entry requirements at Level 2 (typically GCSEs) and Level 3 (typically A levels), have submitted an acceptable personal statement and reference, and have completed the UCAT within the required timeframe (A200 only), your application will be given an academic score based on the qualifications you have completed.
 - 4.1.1 Applications are scored based on achieved qualifications only.
 - 4.2.2 Mandatory subjects are scored first, then a score given to the remaining highest graded subjects.
 - 4.2.3 If you fail to submit two scores for double science by the deadline, you will be given an assumed grade at one grade lower than the grade given. For example, if you state you achieved an A grade, you will be scored assuming you achieved AB grades.
 - 4.2.4 The UCAT may be used in the A200 selection process where the number of applicants with the same score exceeds the number of interview places.
- 4.3 Additional consideration is given in the scoring process for:
 - applicants who are classed as contextual. Please see the <u>contextual admissions policy</u> for more information on who is considered contextual and how this is applied to each programme.
 - Welsh-domiciled applicants.
 - applicants who have completed or are participating in one of the following widening participation initiatives in the year of application, and meet the minimum entry requirements, will be guaranteed an interview:
 - o Cardiff University Step-Up to University programme
 - Cardiff University Sutton Trust Dental Summer School
 - Deintyddion Yfory (Tomorrow's Dentists)
 - The North Wales Dentistry Scheme
 - applicants who are part of our High Performance Sports programmes. Please see the <u>full policy</u> for more information on eligibility and how this is applied to each programme.
 - applicants who are currently enrolled on the <u>International Foundation Year in</u>
 Health, Medical and Life Sciences at the Cardiff University International Study Centre
 - B750 or B752 only: applicants who are currently enrolled on the Cardiff University
 Pathway to Dental Hygiene and Dental Therapy
 - B750 or B752 only: applicants who are domiciled in Wales and have either completed or are pending a Level 3/4 Access to Higher Education Diploma.
 - 4.3.1 If you are eligible in more than one category listed above, you will only be given additional consideration in one of these categories.

5. Oversubscription

5.1 The School of Dentistry has in place an oversubscription policy to manage numbers on each course, as these are capped by the Welsh Government. Please see the <u>oversubscription policy</u> for more information on who this may apply to and how and when it may be used.
