



Web Development using HTML and CSS

Learn how to build a website using HTML (Hyper Text Markup Language), CSS (Cascading Style Sheets) and jQuery (Javascript). This is a HTML and CSS coding course and all coursework will be coded by hand without the use of any drag/drop functionality, or tools such as DreamWeaver and WordPress. Minimal ¡Query coding will be covered as pre-built ¡Query components such as sliders, accordions, drop-down menus and slideshows will be used. Course content includes adding headers, text, links, images, tables, lists, menus, Google maps, YouTube videos and forms, plus an introduction to Responsive Web Design and the principles of SEO (Search Engine Optimisation). No prior knowledge of HTML, CSS or jQuery is required.

Student Finance Wales
