Literature Wales is a national organisation and its aim is to support and develop Wales' oldest artform, through working collaboratively and in a wide range of communities, to make literature relevant for all. Literature Wales' projects include Writers on Tour funding scheme for local organisers, initiatives to engage children and young people – Bardd Plant Cymru and Young People's Laureate, support for writers including bursaries, mentoring and course at Tŷ Newydd Writing Centre, and transformative outreach schemes such as the South Wales Literature Development Initiative.
South Wales Literature Project – The South Wales Literature Development Initiative (SWLDI) has been running successfully since 2007 and currently works in Torfaen, Caerphilly, Neath Port Talbot, Vale of Glamorgan and Newport.
