We're united by one goal – to improve the future of dental care across Wales, the UK and beyond.



Dental Surgery (BDS)


UCAS code: A200

As a Dentist, you'll lead a dental team, diagnose and treat dental diseases, and repair dental and related facial injuries.

You'll build a strong knowledge of human anatomy and oral diseases, develop your clinical skills in real-world scenarios, and eventually manage and look after your own patients.

When you graduate, you can register with the General Dental Council and treat patients across a range of settings, such as community clinics, general practice, dental hospitals, and the armed forces.

This course is also the perfect launchpad for a career as a specialist in a particular area of dentistry, or as a researcher, exploring some of the biggest challenges facing our society.

Dental Therapy and Hygiene (BSc)

UCAS code: B752

As a Dental Therapist and Hygienest, you'll be an integral member of the dental team.


You'll carry out a range of procedures such as fillings, scaling, polishing, gum disease treatments, placing crowns on primary teeth, and extracting primary teeth.

You'll also play a key role in supporting patients during their treatment journey, and giving them the knowledge and confidence to look after their oral health.

From your first year of study, you'll be immersed in real clinical scenarios with a variety of patients, where you'll put your clinical skills into practice.

When you graduate, you can register with the General Dental Council and treat patients across a range of settings, such as community clinics, general practice, dental hospitals and schools, and the armed forces.

If you're committed to working in Wales for two years after you graduate, you can apply for NHS funding to support your studies.

UCAS code: B750


As a Dental Hygienist, you'll support patients during their treatment journey, and give them the knowledge and confidence to look after their oral health.

When you graduate, you can register with the General Dental Council and treat patients across a range of settings, such as community clinics, general practice, dental hospitals and schools, and the armed forces.

If you're committed to working in Wales for 18 months after you graduate, you can apply for NHS funding to support your studies.


The chance to change lives
